RELATIONSHIP, RAISING, RELEASE


The biblical model of discipleship is a loving father/son relationship in which the heart of the father is intentionally passed to the son to the point where he can repeat the process on his own.

- 2. It's about making "mini mes" or being best friends.
- 3. It's trying to force someone to grow.
- 4. It's just teaching people doctrine.

Discipleship is imparting both the words of Christ and the life of Christ.

- 1. By accepting your unique role as a father
 - Seeing someone saved is only 1/3 of the Great Commission.

2. By being with them

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

RAISING: INTENTIONALLY PASSING ON YOUR HEART

- If someone is close enough to get your heart; they're close enough to hurt you.
- 1. By caring for them as a father

3. By remembering that you're passing on what you've been given
